# District Procedures

CADET

CADET – 1001.1

Cadet Firefighters

## IDENTIFICATION

A RED STRIPE shall identify all Cadet Firefighters, placed across the top of the helmet, front to back.

## GENERAL TRAINING

The Chief Officer shall assign a mentor Senior Firefighter or Officer for each Cadet.

The Cadets will become familiar with the District's Policies, Procedures and SOG's.

The Cadets will be subject to the District administered respiratory test and inoculation and immunization program.

Records of participation, training, and completed task books are held in the Cadets training file. Upon completion of the Cadet program, these records will apply towards state-certified firefighting training.

## OPERATIONAL TRAINING

Cadets shall attend all District mandatory drills as well as minimum attendance requirements for all other drills.

Cadets will train under the District's Policies, Procedures, and SOG's as they apply to the program.

Cadets will enroll in and successfully complete the First Responder and Yamhill County Firefighter I Academy, within 12 months after entering the program.

Cadets will attain their healthcare provider CPR card.

## TRAINING RESTRICTIONS

Cadets shall not act in the capacity of a line officer or a Chief Officer.

Cadets shall not enter burning buildings or any involved structure.

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Cadets shall not advance to a position above the ground on any burning structure.

Cadets shall not participate in any traffic control squad until completion of training and approval by the Chief Officer.

Cadets shall not operate any hand power equipment during any emergency incident.

Cadets shall not respond to any alarm, while attending regular school classes.

## APPARATUS – GENERAL

The Cadets will be under the guidance of their assigned mentor senior firefighter or officer during the apparatus-training program. They receive operating procedures for fire apparatus, but not regularly assigned as apparatus operators on alarm or incident responses.

## APPARATUS – OPERATIONAL

Cadets shall not displace non-cadet firefighters on responding apparatus. No more than one (1) Cadet shall respond on any apparatus unless approved by the Chief Officer or officer in charge.

## APPARTUS – RESTRICTIONS

Cadets shall not act in the capacity of a line officer or Chief Officer.

Cadet shall not drive any District vehicle.

Cadets shall not drive their personal vehicles to a scene of any incident while acting as a Cadet Firefighter.

## DISCIPLINE

Cadets who perform actions of gross negligence or a disregard for safety at any time, will be removed from the fire ground or incident area by a senior firefighter or officer. The senior firefighter or officer will document the action and submit a written report directly to the Chief Officer.

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A senior firefighter or officer mentor will document all repeat offenses of negative interpersonal relationships or attitude, and, they will file a written report directed to the Chief Officer.

The Chief Officer will be responsible for supervising corrective behavior or disciplinary action with the Cadet, as necessary.
